English Tasks

- Can you write 2-3 sentences about your weekend news. Try and include: First and Next. Can you also include the tricky words: into, me and are?
- We are reading the story 'The Worrysaurus' in class. You can follow along with the book [here](#). In the story, the Worrysaurus has a tin filled with things that make him happy. Can you draw 3 things that make you happy and label them? For an extra challenge write 2-3 sentences about the objects you have chosen.
- Practice some digraphs (two letters making one sound, e.g. 'ch'. How many can you sound out? Next have a go reading some words with different digraphs. You can play Buried Treasure on Phonics Play.

Maths Tasks

- We are learning about subtraction this week and will sing along to the song '[10 little honeybees](#)'. Have a go at learning the song and joining in. Ask an adult to pause the video so you can work out the sums.
- Follow the subtraction PowerPoint [here](#). Have a go at some subtraction sums up to 10 (e.g. $10-2=?$). For an extra challenge try some sums up the number 20 (e.g. $16-5=?$)
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- Complete 5 activities on Mathletics.

Topic Tasks

- **Minibeasts.** Our mini beast this week is the Ladybird. Can you research information about the lady bird? What does it like to eat? Where does it live? This video [here](#) may be useful.

<p>PE Challenge <i>Socks in a box</i></p> <p>How many socks can you pair up and throw in the box in 2 minutes?</p> <p>Place LOTS of unpaired socks five steps away from a box or circle.</p> <p>Aim: Match the pairs of socks together, then aim and try to throw them in the box.</p> <p>How many can you get?</p>	<p>Have a go at learning the ladybird song here. Can you ask a grown up to send in a video or some pictures to your teacher?</p>	<p>Read through the Truthfulness and Honesty PowerPoint here. Discuss with an adult why it is important to be honest and tell the truth.</p>	<p>Act out different mini beasts. Ask an adult to guess what mini beast it is.</p>
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Mosaic YouTube

We hope you are enjoying the videos on Mosaic's new YouTube channel. As the weeks go on we will continue uploading videos on a range of subjects including, Phonics, Maths, Jewish Learning and more. Below is some guidance on how these videos can be used.

1. **Phase 2 and 3 phonics/Phase 2 and 3 tricky words** - can be used daily and without adult input. If we were in school we would be reviewing these sounds and tricky words each day with the children. Children can also practise writing the tricky words independently.
2. **Number of the week** - complete each time there is a new number posted, can be used twice with children for practise. If you create the template for the children they may be able to do most of it independently.
3. **Maths topics e.g. 3D/2D shapes** - can be used once and then used as a quick recap. Adult input generally required.
4. **Phonics sounds e.g. ch phonics** - can be used once or until children feel confident with that sound. Please note children will often recognise the sounds such as 'ch, sh, ai' on their own but find it trickier to read these in words so practise is key! Children can watch this video independently but adult input required for any challenges or extra work.
5. **Story times and other videos** - use as often as you want! Children can watch these independently.
