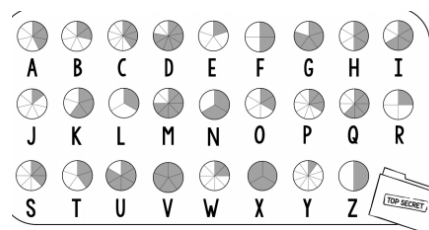
English Tasks

Derrick's Spelling Story



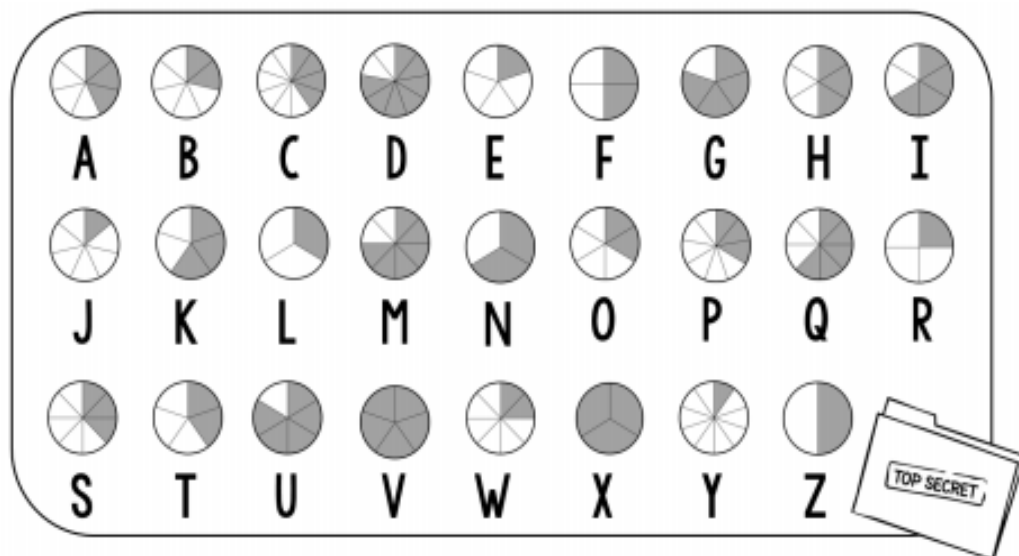
- **Reading Eggspress:** Complete reading comprehension, spelling and library book task.
