Grape Aleph

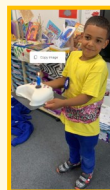
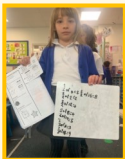

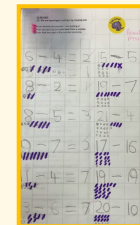
Barley Aleph

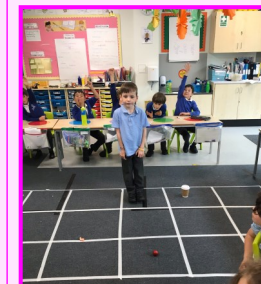


Barley Bet

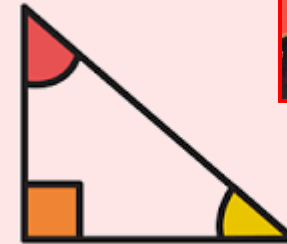
Fig Aleph

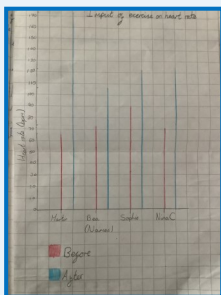
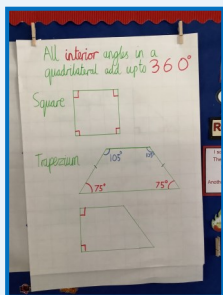
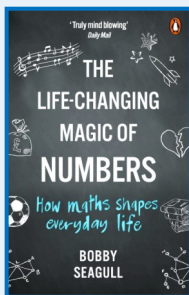
Pomegranate Bet
