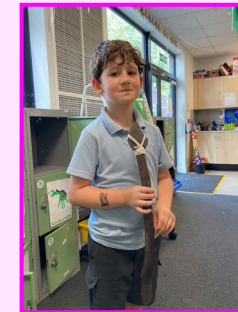
**Wheat Bet**

Barley Aleph

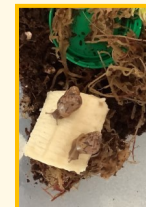

Grape Bet have had a very creative week! We have been studying Ibn Battuta in topic and highlighting the expeditions he made on a map. We have been consolidating our learning on 3D shapes and making our own out of playdoh and lollipop sticks to

help us to remember the properties! We have also been creating our own animals from playdoh and thinking how they would adapt to different environments. We have some very exciting news - we also have some caterpillar friends in our classroom who are exceptionally hungry and we are enjoying watching them grow!

Fig had an exciting start to the week spending a day in Year 4. The teachers were extremely impressed with how well they all behaved. In English this week, we have been finishing our topic on Instructions. The class all worked extremely hard and Mr Salmond was impressed with their big writes. 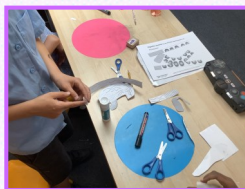
**Pomegranate Bet**

In Music, Pomegranate Bet continued to practise their glockenspiel skills, this time playing Twinkle Twinkle Little Star and You Are My Sunshine.

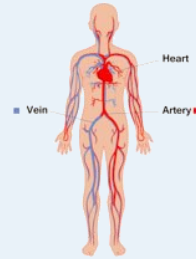
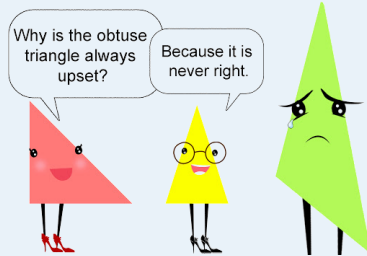
Our Jewish Learning lesson consisted of exploring Kosher food laws and creating a weekly
