
Reception Year 2


Year 1


Barley Aleph and Barley Bet

Grape Aleph and Grape Bet



Year 3 Year 5



This week we have worked on metric measures with conversions and calculations: it's been great to build upon our earlier learning of multiplying and dividing by 10, 100, and 1000! In Science, we have started working on circuits and using the appropriate symbols to represent various components. This will prepare us for our investigations later on this term


Key Stage One
