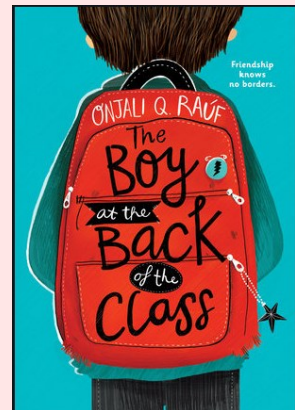
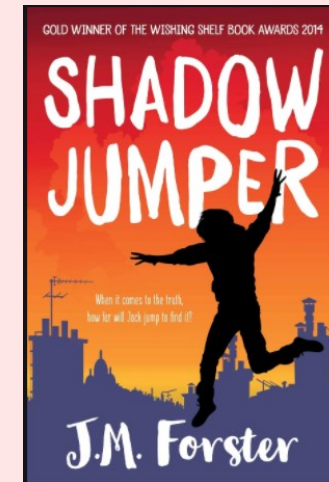


Fig Aleph

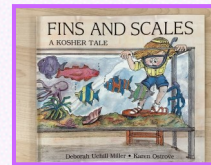

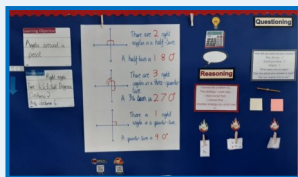
In English, we started reading the book "The Iron Man" by Ted Hughes and brushed up on our investigative skills by writing questions and factual sentences using modal verbs.


