#### **Grape Aleph and Grape Bet**


Grape classes have had a very busy week learning all about the ness suffix in English, we have been writing recipes to make a Miss Trunchbull with ingredients


#### Olive Aleph


#### **Date Aleph**




Dear Parents and Carers.
