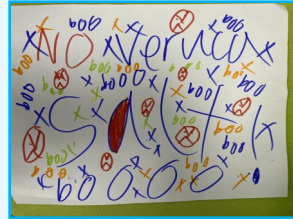
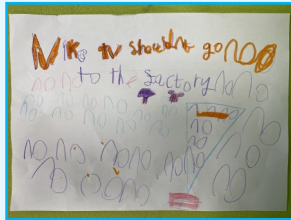
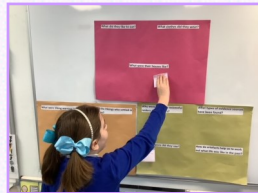
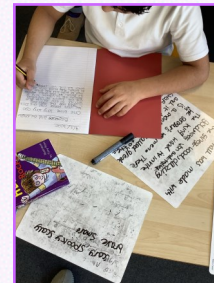
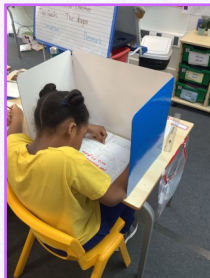
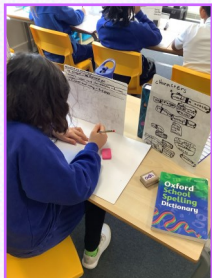


Fig Aleph

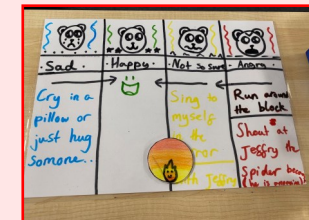
**Pomegranate Aleph and Pomegranate Bet**

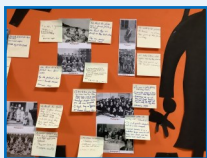
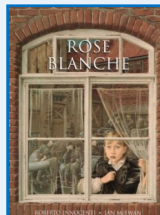

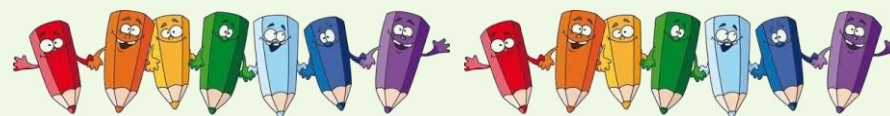
Key Stage One
