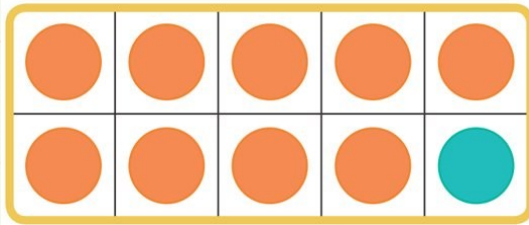
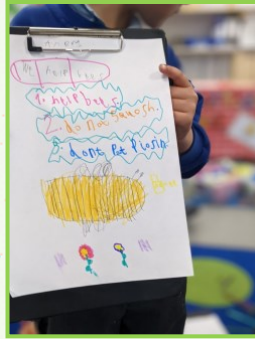


### Wheat Aleph

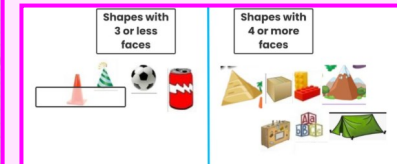
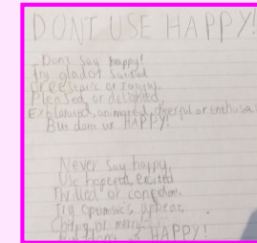
### Wheat Bet

### Grape Aleph

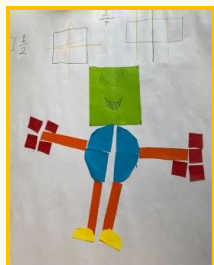
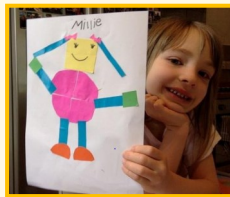

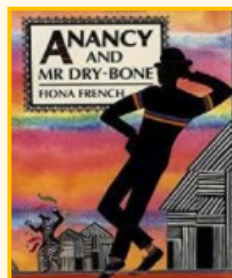
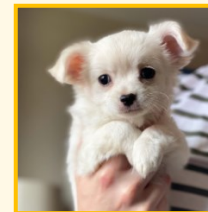
### Barley Aleph

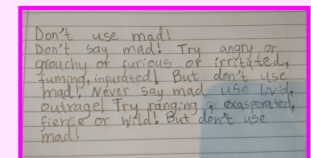
### Barley Bet

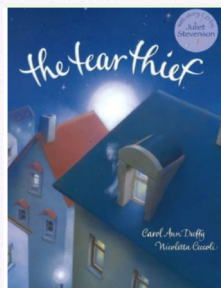


## Year 4

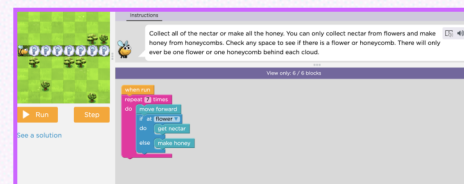

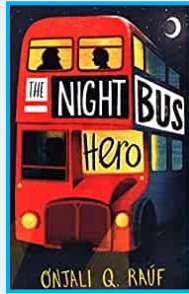


## Pomegranate Bet

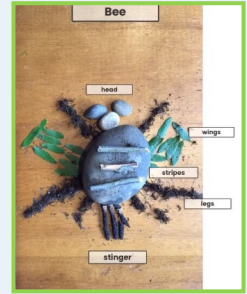


### Attendance

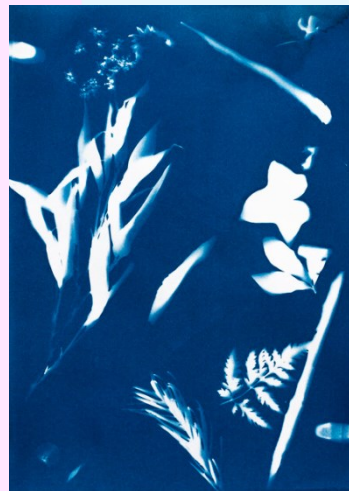
## A Greener Picture
